The Clerk thanked the Council for their patience in settling in to her new role.


21/37 CHAIRMANS REPORT

She had noted that the footpaths officer had not been invited to the meeting, the Clerk will ensure he is invited next time.

Cllr King – advised that he was part of the Highways Speedwatch group.



Cllr Edwards – had received correspondence reading a campaign to reduce the speed limit to 20 mph through the villages along the B3092 and would forward the details to Councillors.

Gillingham Ward Monthly Report Cllr Belinda Ridout – March 21

Dorset Local Plan Consultation finishes on 15th March, 2021. As at 8th March, Dorset Council has received over 1,700 responses, equating to over 10,000 comments. Many comments around housing figures (Standard Methodology) and making developers build carbon neutral homes. Dorset Council can only encourage and support carbon neutral development at this current time, it cannot be mandated. Change in the Standard Methodology and building regulations has to come from central government. Still awaiting details of the government's new 'Homes Standard' policy.

<u>COVID update</u> – As at 5th March, the case rate for the Dorset Council area is 51.3 per 100,000 population and for BCP, 63.0 per 100,000 population. The rate for the South West is 46.1 per 100,000 and for England its 86.4. Covid-19 patients in hospital beds in Dorset: 68 (compared to 147 as at 26th February). This shows the continued decline of COVID cases locally, thanks to lockdown measures. Over a quarter of a million local people have had at least one dose of the vaccination!

<u>Household Recycling Centres (HRC's)</u> - DC has made the plea for residents **not** to visit a household recycling centre right now unless waste cannot be stored safely at home. This is due to rising visitor numbers following recent warm weather, as visitors drop off their items, primarily garden waste and wood, which is starting to cause long queues, creating access problems for residents, businesses and kerbside collection vehicles. England is still very much in lockdown and social distancing measures are important to help contain the virus. Public health guidance states we should all be avoiding unnecessary travel right now, including the local HRC.

<u>Climate Change Consultation update</u> - a Climate Change & Ecological Executive Advisory Panel meeting took place on Friday, 26th February to receive a briefing on the consultations, (the main consultation and the Youth Survey), and to agree amendments to the Strategy and Action Plan documents.

<u>Main Consultation</u> – 1519 responses received from all over Dorset. A breakdown of the individual responses showed that the 45-64 and 65+ age groups were the main responders. Broken down into categories: 1359 members of the public, followed by organisations, 53 (which included Extinction Rebellion, RSPB, CPRE, National Trust, and community groups), Businesses 16 and Parish Councils, 40. The amended Strategy document and Action Plan will be scrutinised at the next Scrutiny and Overview committees on 25th March.

Results indicated an overall broad agreement with the approach of the Strategy Document and Action Plan. The main negative comments related to the Carbon targets set for Dorset Council <u>itself</u> at 2040 and the Dorset Council <u>area</u> at 2050 (which would require the support of central Government and everyone in Dorset taking action. Members were reminded that these targets are not fixed, that Dorset Council's aim is to reduce its carbon footprint before these deadlines. Note: Dorset Council is responsible for only 1% of Dorset's carbon footprint.

<u>Youth Survey</u> - this has been a great success. **It is still live until the end of March.** 1495 responses so far. 87.3% of respondents felt that tackling climate change is vitally important.

92% felt that Dorset Council's target to be carbon neutral by 2040 is a good idea and very important.

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<u>New Trees Policy</u> – this will be going to Cabinet shortly. This document outlines the approach taken in the management of Council owned trees, covering replacement of trees felled, climate change tree planting, large scale tree planting linking into Climate Change policy, nitrate mitigation, bio-diversity, long term sustainable tree works.

Gypsy & Traveller update

I have spoken with Paula Clover recently, Gypsy & Traveller Liaison Officer. As you know, one of the gypsies died and his partner is still very depressed about that. Paula has not started any legal work with them yet because of lockdown but will make progress on this towards the end of April/May as lockdown eases. The courts are very backed up at the moment and the council would have to present a very good reason for moving people on. With regard to litter, Paula received a complaint from the gypsies about the fly tipping in the other layby. They normally try to clear it up but it is so much they cannot cope with it. Paula is to investigate this week.
